# FORMATTING OF A RESOLUTION

---

- All resolutions must be in size 12 Times New Roman.
- Sub-sub-clauses are the maximum indented clause type allowed. There must be a minimum of two sub-clauses or sub-sub clauses.
- For all committees with the exception of the Security Council, there must be a minimum of 3 pre-ambulatory clauses and 7 operative clauses.
- A sample resolution is presented below:

**Commission:** General Assembly

**Sponsors:** Delegate of Norway

**Co-sponsors:**

**Topic:** Moderated Legalization of Whale Hunting

Bearing in mind that 30,000 whales have been killed since the ban in 1982 due to loopholes that countries exploit to conduct commercial whaling,

Fully aware that there are accidents such as the misplacement of a spear can lead to a brutal, violent death for sentient cetaceans, and this conduct should be considered in humane and barbaric,

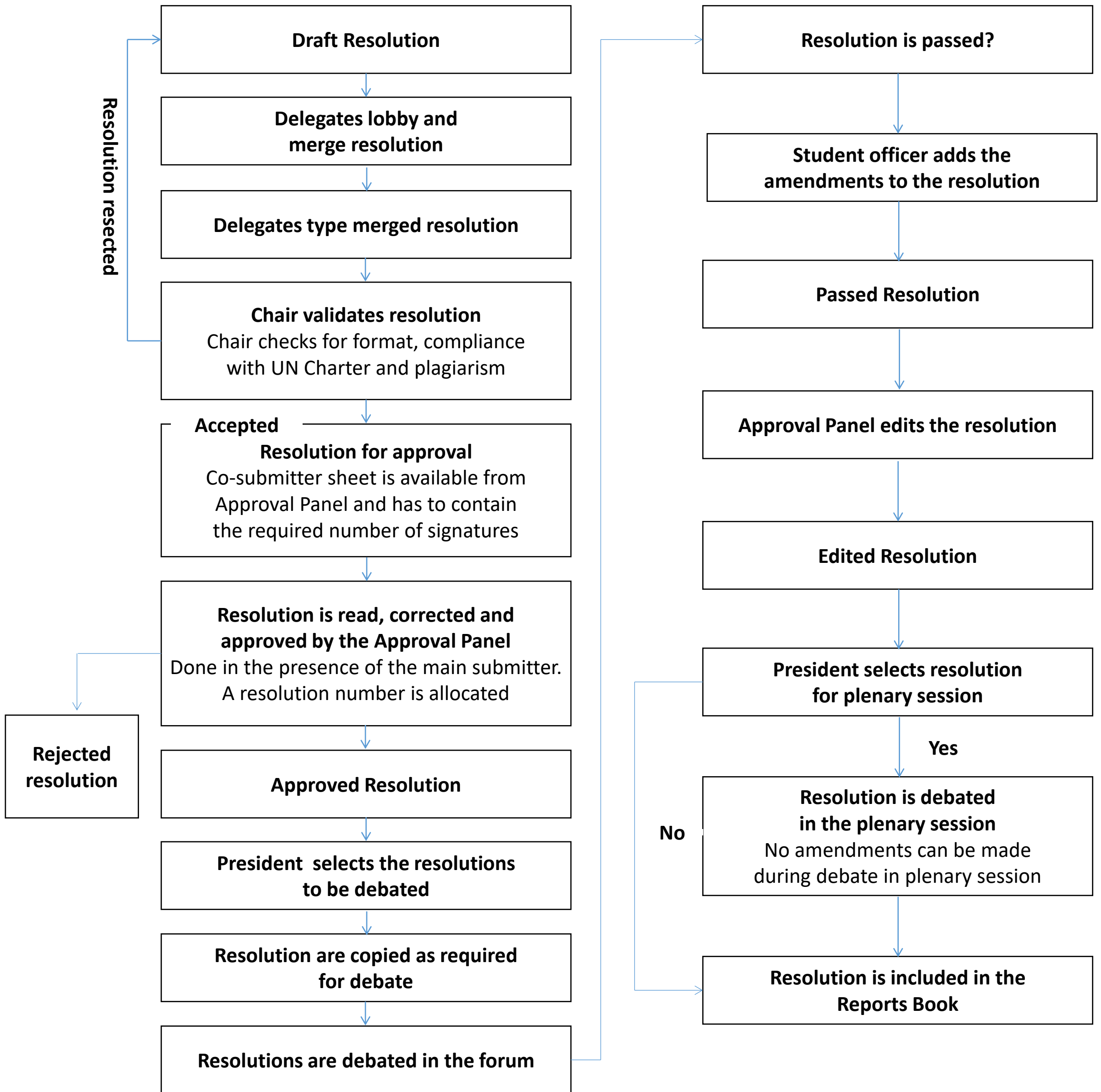
Declaring that with the use of technology we could get whale hunting under satisfying control, both by humans and methodology,

Concerned that if the issue is inconsiderate towards cultural context that the resulting consequences in cultural whale hunting communities, who are reliant upon said whale hunting, would be subsequently devastated,

1. Suggests to call for a referendum regarding the change in policy on whale hunting in order to be considerate to cultural context within those unique communities who engage in whale hunting as a traditional and food gathering means;
2. Accepts the use of 'Blue Boxes' which is an automated electronic monitoring system developed for monitoring the minke whale hunting in Norway and wishes to extend its use to all available whale species and populations;
3. Requests to ban whale hunting for scientific research, in such ways but not limited to:
  - a. Implement rigid policies with an absence of loopholes so that countries cannot exploit laws by redefining laws by such means as:
    - i . Controlled whale hunting can only be conducted when done for ritualistic or traditional purposes;
    - ii . Ritualistic whale societies include countries or ethnic groups that have had whaling practices as part of their culture for centuries and are reliant upon it whether for traditional or for food consumption purposes;
    - iii . All societies that have been recognized as legitimate whale hunting communities adhere to strict quotas, as to not decimate whale populations;
4. Recommends raising breeding programs worldwide as well as monitoring services that track whale populations and can ensure their sustainable growth;
5. Calls for the development of whale hunting tools that kill more effectively to ensure a more humane death of the hunted whales than previous methodologies.
